Adult Immunizations

Adult immunizations are the most convenient and safest preventable care measures available. Childhood vaccines wear off over time and as we age, we are at risk for different diseases. What vaccinations you need are determined in discussion with your doctor and based on age, previous immunizations, health conditions, lifestyle, travel habits, and job. Consider the following vaccinations:

Influenza (flu) – every year.

Tetanus, Diphtheria and pertussis – (Tdap & Td) – 1 dose as a child and a Td booster every 10 years. Tdap booster for women during every pregnancy.

Shingles Zoster – 2 doses (RZV) at age 50 (preferred) or 1 dose (ZVL) at age 60.

Pneumococcal – 1 dose of each of the 2 vaccines depending on age and health.

Meningococcal – 1 or both of the 2 types of vaccines available depending on age and health.

Human papillomavirus (HPV) – for women to age 27 and men to age 22. This is a relatively new vaccine series and is typically given to pre-teens (before they have a boyfriend or girlfriend) to prevent uterine, penile, vagina, anal, and oral cancers.

Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) – If born before 1957 (initial) or if age 50 or older (booster).

Chickenpox Varicella – if you did not receive this vaccine as a child.

Hepatitis A and B - if you did not receive this vaccine as a child.

Haemophilus influenzae type b – if you did not receive this vaccine as a child.

If you are traveling outside the U.S., you may need additional vaccinations. Ask your health professional at least 6 weeks before travel.

Health Ministry Tips

KEEP FALLS OUT OF YOUR FALL(AUTUMN!): One in four adults falls each year and these falls can result in serious and costly injuries. Consider taking these steps to prevent falls: 1) Do an assessment regarding your risk. 2) Enlist others to help (doctor, family and friends). 3) Develop a prevention action plan, such as looking at lighting, stairs, floors. Maybe start an exercise program to improve strength and balance. 4) Implement the action plan. DENTAL HYGIENE AWARENESS MONTH: Healthy habits, including brushing and flossing, can prevent tooth decay(cavities) and gum disease. You can prevent most problems by taking action: * Brush your teeth 2 times a day with fluoride toothpaste * Floss between your teeth every day * Replace toothbrush every 3 months or when bristles become bent * Visit a dentist regularly for a checkup and cleaning * Cut down on sugary foods and drinks * Do not smoke or chew tobacco * If you drink alcohol, drink only in moderation.

OCTOBER IS BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH: Breast cancer is the second most common kind of cancer in women. About 1 in 8 women in the United States will get breast cancer sometime during her life. The good news is that mammograms can help detect breast cancer early. Check with your medical provider today about setting a mammogram appointment and get tested.
