

As your pastor, I am always impressed by the love I see in the families of our parish community and am constantly giving God thanks for your many efforts that truly uphold the dignity of marriage and family life. Thank you!

As you work hard to create safe havens for your children and spouse, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), our bishop, Bishop Gregory Parkes, and I wish to bring one particular issue to your attention. It is not easy to discuss, but it is important. That issue is pornography.

In November 2015, the USCCB approved a pastoral response to pornography, called *Create in Me a Clean Heart*. The intention of writing this document was to:

- offer healing and hope to those who have been wounded by pornography;
- articulate the Catholic Church's response to the pastoral crisis brought about by the production and use of pornography; and
- raise awareness of its pervasiveness and harms.

Why? Because pornography is hurting many people, including marriages and families, singles, priests and religious, and even children. It hurts the healthy process of vocational discernment for our young people. Pornography use impacts the relationships of children with their parents, husbands with their wives (and vice versa), the pastor with his community, and most importantly, our relationship with our Lord.

In their formal statement, the USCCB speak directly to parents about being proactive about the issue of pornography in the life of the home with their children, and together as a married couple, ensure the home keeps its status as a safe haven for all. The Bishops state, "*The use of pornography by anyone in the home deprives the home of its role as a safe haven and has negative effects throughout a family's life and across generations.*" (p. 15)


Thus, Bishop Parkes has asked all parishes throughout the Diocese of St. Petersburg to celebrate Safe Haven Sunday this weekend, March 3, 2019, with the theme "*Equipping the Family, Safeguarding Children.*" This awareness

effort is meant to draw our attention as a community to the seriousness of the issues of pornography and to recommit ourselves to take steps to ensure our homes are safe havens for all. There is a book available published by Covenant Eyes that can be ordered by visiting our welcome desk or calling the parish office. We would also like to invite you to participate in the, "*The Equipped 7-Day Challenge: A Digital Crash Course*" by texting SECURE to 66866 to receive seven days of e-mailed digital tips! (An opt-in e-mail campaign that provides short, practical videos that will help parents protect their children from online dangers).



Lever shere a shere

It all started in Sicily. Agriculture was important to the island and there had been no rain to nourish the crops. The dried-out wheat stalks cracked beneath the feet of the poor farmers as they walked through their barren fields. Only a sea of dust and withered vines remained from what had once been row upon row of brightly colored fruits and vegetables. The only thing that thrived was the fava bean which is why it is now commonly called "the lucky bean."

The situation was critical and so the people prayed. They pleaded with St. Joseph, their patron, for relief from the terrible famine that gripped the island. Finally, the skies opened, sending down the lifegiving water. The people



rejoiced. Later, to show their gratitude, they prepared a table with a special assortment of foods they had harvested. After paying honor to St. Joseph, they distributed the food to the less fortunate.

The first St. Joseph Altar, therefore, was set up on the Island of Sicily. It was a small one, but as time went on and the tradition took hold, the flamboyant nature and creative spirit of the Italians caused the altars to grow larger and more ornate.

Through Sicilian immigrants, the custom of St. Joseph Altars was introduced to America. But now the celebration is not confined to any nationality. Rather, it has become a public event which its devoted participants embrace for a host of private and personal reasons. The feast is alternately a source of petition and of thanksgiving.

Many families believe that having a St. Joseph Altar can bring good fortune. It is common to hear stories about favors received (a loved one's recovery from an illness, for example) which are in turn attributed to the family's dedication to St. Joseph. But whatever the reasons, people became involved in the St. Joseph Feast. One of the special customs calls for the selection of children to portray members of the Holy Family – Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Angels and favorite saints may also be introduced into the ritual which begins with the "saints" going door to door to seek aid until finally reaching the place where the altar is on display.

After the Holy Family has eaten, guests may partake of the meal. Most of the foods presented on the altar are acquired through begging, a symbolic gesture that represents what the poor of Sicily were forced to do. When the feast is over, the remaining food and whatever money has been collected are given to the poor.

St. Joseph Altar is a reflection of a deep devotion to St. Joseph, the patron of those in need – workers, travelers, the persecuted, the poor, the aged, the dying. And it is a custom that has enjoyed a resurgence in recent years as young and old have begun to rediscover their heritage.






