

Phyllis' message to our community:

St Jerome Early Childhood Center

My name is Phyllis Steele and I am honored to join the St. Jerome community as the new director of your



Early Childhood Center. My husband and I were very pleased to send our four children to this wonderful school. I also had the pleasure of teaching here as a VPK instructor for two years. I have a master's degree in Education and have spent my entire career dedicated to teaching. Most recently, I have taught for eight years at Morning Star Catholic School in Pinellas Park. My experiences in Early Childhood and Special Education have been a true blessing in my life. I intend to use my energy, professional knowledge and Catholic faith to uphold the standards of excellence which have been established by your current director, Denise Roach.

Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence

The dual disciplines of fasting and abstinence have a long history

in the Catholic Church. Going back to the early Church, the purpose behind the custom of self denial is not punishment; it is to simplify our lifestyles so that we create a certain emptiness. In this way, freed from all distractions, we are able to hear and respond to God's continued call to conversion and holiness.

- *Fasting* is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 to 59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. "Pastors of souls and parents are to ensure that even those who by reason of their age are not bound by the law of fasting and abstinence, are taught the true meaning of penance." (Canon 1252)

The Catholic Church requires her members to fast on Good Friday (see exceptions on next page), and encourages her members to continue this Paschal Fast until the Easter Vigil, but she does not require this prolongation by law. Catholics are also required to keep the Eucharistic Fast every time they receive Holy Communion, including during the Paschal Triduum. "Let the Paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, as a way of coming to the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection with uplifted and welcoming hearts." (Ceremonial of Bishops, n. 295; see Sacrosanctum Concilium, n. 110)

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should <u>u</u>ndertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

What work of preparation can we do as a family?





St. Jerome Catechesis of the Good Shepherd All About the Atrium

Purple is for preparation.....

What does this season of preparation mean for our children and families? Why purple? Related to the season of Lent, the effort we put into these 40 days will make the celebration of Easter a richer and fuller encounter with the Lord. In both the Old and New Testament, purple is found to be a rare and valuable color

symbolizing royalty, wealth and status. In ancient times, the dye used to create purple was not only very expensive to produce, but it was also labor intensive. It was considered a great luxury. In the Hebrew Scriptures, it was worn by kings, used in curtains and carpets in the tabernacle, adorned the altar in the temple and was repeatedly shown to be a costly linen. In the gospels, the Roman soldiers dress Jesus in a purple robe before he begins his walk to Calvary. Each Lent, we are called as his disciples, to walk with him on this journey. How do we speak of this to the children? We know that young children are very sensitive to and have a great interest in colors. When they are small, children enjoy identifying their favorite color. They take great delight in finding their favorite color in the clothes they wear, the food they eat and items discovered in their environment. For the very young child, colors help offer shape and identity. In the Atrium, we speak about purple as the color for waiting and preparing. Through the presentations of the Liturgical Colors, and later The Liturgical Calendar, the child discovers that the season of Lent is a time of preparation for the great feast of Easter. Through these presentations, along with the solemn changing of the color of the cloth on the prayer table, the children come to participate in the liturgical life of the Church.

How do we prepare as a family?

Purple on your table -

The Prayer Table – a small table adorned with a purple cloth, votive candle and a Bible resting on a small pillow. Are there other images that you would add to this sacred space? Allow your children to spend time at the prayer table alone, and then gather as a family to offer prayers of thanksgiving.

The Art Table – offer your children purple paper and/or purple colored pencils on the art shelf.




The Homeless Ministry ...

Diabetes Alert!

Before people develop type 2 diabetes, they almost always have "prediabetes" — blood glucose levels that are higher than normal but not yet high enough to be diagnosed as diabetes. There are no clear symptoms of prediabetes, so, you may have it and not know it. You will not develop type 2 diabetes automatically if you have prediabetes. For some people with prediabetes, early treatment can actually return blood glucose levels to the normal range. Research shows that you can lower your risk for type 2 diabetes by 58% by: Losing 7% of your body weight (or 15 pounds if you weigh 200 pounds), Exercising moderately (such as brisk walking) 30 minutes a day, five days a week. 


