



This Lent, as we seek to be more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, who endured the Cross for us, can the testimony of the Gospels startle us to a deeper faith in God's mercy?

Father Paul Deutsch, SJ, currently resides at Jesuit High School in Tampa where he is the academic counselor for the sophomores at JHS. Growing up, he lived on air force bases in five different states, most exciting was Alaska (lots of snow). He is blessed with 4 sisters & 1 brother and 16 nieces & nephews – most of whom reside in Texas. After high school he majored in Chemical Engineering at Texas A&M; and upon graduation, he entered the Jesuits in 1979. Ordained to the priesthood in June 1990, Fr. Deutsch's ministry assignments have been divided between Jesuit high schools (Dallas & Tampa) and province administration (New Orleans & St. Louis). The most recent marvels for him in his prayer life and priestly ministry have been audiobooks, Bishop Barron's Word on Fire, and the Catholic website <Formed.org>.

For the past several years, St. Jerome Parish has collected items necessary to utilize the shower program, a program for homeless families and individuals, run by the St. Vincent de Paul facility on 4th Street in St. Petersburg. 

"dollar store" is another great source of inexpensive toiletries. St. Jerome contributions to this program are vital to providing as much as 80 showers per week to needy people. Thanks for your continuing support.



# Lent for Children

During the season of Lent, the younger children will explore the Last Supper. They will also come to know the names of sacred sites in the City of Jerusalem. The older child revisits the work of the Cenacle, but will also have an opportunity to read the paschal narratives.

## Prepare as a family -

Talk about the importance of tradition for passing on what is important in your lives and make connections to the Last Supper.

- What tradition did Jesus give us at the Last Supper?
- What did He say? (Note: Do not make the connection between the Last Supper and the Liturgy, it is important for the child to make that discovery for him or herself).

**Note:** In the Atrium, we always talk about the events of Jesus' death <u>in conjunction with</u> the events of Jesus' Rising. It is crucial **not** to separate the two. Sofia Cavalletti explains in Religious Potential of the Child: "Death is a common event; many men have had the courage to face death for love of their brothers. What is absolutely **new** is that, in Jesus, death is followed by **renewed** and **eternal life...**. To us it seems appropriate to avoid long accounts of the passion, in order to balance the length of the passion narration with the account of the resurrection."




