

Why are the Crucifix, statues, and images covered in the church?

It is the custom of the Catholic Church in the United States to cover crosses and images from the conclusion of the Mass for the Saturday of the Fourth Week of Lent prior to the celebration of the Fifth Sunday of Lent.

"This custom probably goes back to the "hunger cloth" or Lenten veil which, from the eleventh century was suspended in front of the altar at the beginning of Lent in order to hide it from the congregation. A possible reason for this original custom was the fact that there were public sinners present among the faithful. In point of fact, as part of the penitential rite these people were excluded from the church at the beginning of Lent, but, since all knew themselves to be sinners (as, for example, the extension of the rite of ashes to all the faithful shows), the community (it was thought) should be, and wished to be deprived of the sight of the altar. At times, reference was made to a "fast of the eyes."

be, deprived of the sight of the altar. At times, reference was made to a "fast of the eyes." Later on, the hunger cloths became smaller and had pictures of Christ's passion on them.

The veiling of crosses, statues and pictures, which came in somewhat later than veiling of the altar, is perhaps based on the notion of a "fast of the eyes." At the end of the thirteenth century Bishop William Durandus of Mende (Southern France) explains this custom by the fact that Christ veiled his divinity during his passion. Durandus saw this explanation as implied in John 8:59, which read: But Jesus hid himself and left the temple. Prior to Vatican II the editors of the Schott Missal saw the veiling of crosses and so on as intended to remind us of the Redeemer's humiliation and thus imprint the image of the crucified Christ more deeply on our hearts." #### Oral Cancer Month

Oral Cancer includes mouth cancer, tongue cancer, tonsil cancer, and throat cancer. Approximately 53,000 people in the US will be newly diagnosed with oral cancer in 2019. When found at early stages of development, oral cancers can have an 80 to 90 % survival rate. Drugs, alcohol, and exposure to HPV virus are some causes of oral cancer. To prevent oral cancer, teens should receive the HPV vaccinations. Additionally, dentists routinely screen for oral cancers at your regular dental visit but it does help to verify that you are being screened. #### **Autism Awareness Month**

It is estimated that 1 in 59 children have autism today. Autism Spectrum Disorder (the long name) is a group of disorders characterized by problems with communication, social interaction, and sometimes, repetitive behaviors and activities. It occurs more often in boys than girls (4 to 1 ratio). This disorder is not caused by vaccines. There are no cures. However, early diagnoses and therapies, special diet & exercise, and treatment considerations help to minimize symptoms. All children should undergo screening for Autism at ages 18 and 24 months for early diagnoses and intervention. 

But we cannot take the child to Mass, say prayers at night, read out of the Bible and be a weeklong, joyful Christian witness for the child. Only You have their hearts and attention continually.




