




Dear Friends:






Introducing Embrace A ministry to all the people of the parish, Part 2

When Jesus was in His flesh and blood on earth, He spent three years teaching and training ("discipling") his followers. He chose 12 and gave special attention to them. Among the things that He taught them were three particular points that provide the mission of Embrace. Mark 12:30 – "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength". Matt 22:39 – "The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself". And finally, Matt 28:19 - "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". We can state these in a more concise way using these 6 words: Love God. Love others. Make disciples.

The purpose of Embrace is to provide opportunities for each member of the parish to experience the love of God and realize a relationship with Jesus through the Holy Spirit; to identify the specific gifts God has given each of us to be effective in loving others, and to help everyone learn to be comfortable in talking about our faith to those who do not or who no longer worship the God who loves each of us.

VAN DRIVERS NEEDED!


