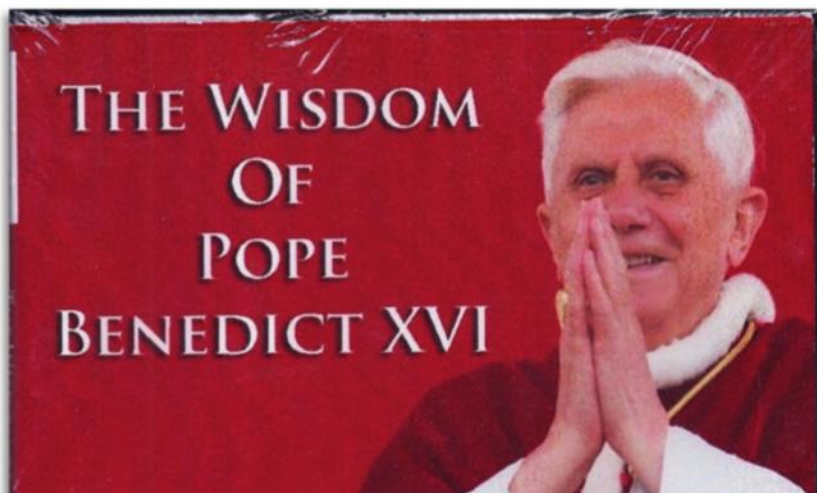
Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Just as in this baptismal dialogue the "no" is expressed in three renunciations, so too the "yes" is expressed in three expressions of loyalty: "yes" to the living God, that is, a God Creator and a creating reason who gives meaning to the cosmos and to our lives; "yes" to Christ, that is, to a God who did not stay hidden but has a name, words, a body and blood; to a concrete God who gives us life and shows us the path of life; "yes" to the communion of the Church, in which Christ is the living God who enters our time, enters our profession, enters daily life.

We might also say that the Face of God, the content of this culture of life, the content of our great "yes", is expressed in the Ten Commandments, which are not a pack of prohibitions, of "noes", but actually present a great vision of life.

They are a "yes" to a God who gives meaning to life (the first three Commandments); a "yes" to the family (Fourth Commandment); a "yes" to life (Fifth Commandment); a "yes" to responsible love (Sixth Commandment); a "yes" to solidarity, to social responsibility, to justice (Seventh Commandment); a "yes" to the truth (Eighth Commandment); a "yes" to respect for others and for their belongings (Ninth and 10th Commandments).

This is the philosophy of life, the culture of life that becomes concrete and practical and beautiful in communion with Christ, the living God, who walks with us in the companionship of his friends, in the great family of the Church. Baptism is a gift of life.

It is a "yes" to the challenge of really living life, of saying "no" to the attack of death that presents itself under the guise of life; and it is a "yes" to the great gift of true life that became present on the Face of Christ, who gives himself to us in Baptism and subsequently in the Eucharist.

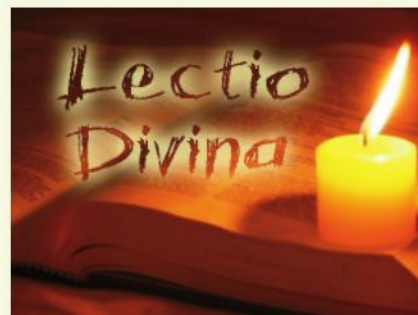

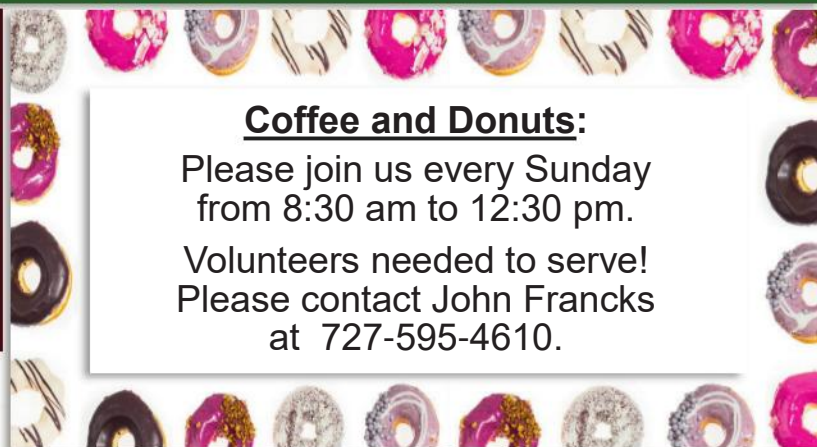

Built For Spirituality

“The **only** thing that **science** has shown to **reliably predict** fulfillment, success, and thriving is a child’s spiritual development. A child’s spirituality comes as **naturally** to children as their fascination with a butterfly or a twinkling star-filled night sky. However, as parents we play a powerful role in our child’s spiritual development, just as we play a powerful role in every other aspect of our child’s development.”

Supporting Your Child’s Spiritual Development:

- “...it happens every time there is a conversation with you (the parent) about life’s big and little questions, such as about meaning and purpose, being good people, how to treat others, what it means to be empathetic and compassionate, and why we need to take care of the earth and our environment”
 - ♦ discuss spiritual experiences with your child
 - ♦ be open to questions, use phrases such as “I wonder” or “let’s think about it together” instead of feeling pressured to have a “right” answer or saying “I don’t know” (which ends the conversation)
- “As parents, we can show our children how we live and express spiritual values in everyday interaction with other people, with animals, with nature, with our own inner life, and with the life of the mind and big idea.”
 - ♦ This includes discipline; when a child is frustrated/upset, try honoring those big feelings with phrases such as, “you have the gift of a great heart, and are sensitive to the situation”; “I noticed you put back the item that didn’t belong to you, in your heart you knew what was right.”
- “We can take our children to explore sacred places and spaces: a house of worship, a sanctuary tucked away in a hospital, a mountain, or a river.”
 - ♦ Point these areas out to your child and listen to how he/she perceives the space
- “We can encourage (and model) acts of expansive love and kindness.”

Have dialogue with your child during these acts, for example, ‘Let’s help this man load his groceries into his car... that filled my heart with joy, how did it make you feel’

“There is no need to have the ‘right’ answers or detailed how-to instructions. Join your child in the moment, let your child be the guide, welcome conversation and leave the conversation open, rather than avoid it or shut it down. You have the opportunity to hop aboard this [spiritual] journey with your child, and through your child’s journey, to travel on your own journey, as well. Say YES and see where you go.”

EMBRACE: EVANGELIZATION & DISCIPLESHIP

“Go and make disciples of all nations” . . . Matthew 28:19

Introducing **EMBRACE**: A ministry to all the people of the parish, Final Part

We have talked a lot about discipleship over the last 5 weeks. There are two things to understand about being a disciple of Jesus, the second person of the Trinity, and therefore God.

First, to be a disciple, to even want to be a disciple of Jesus means that you already have a “relationship with Jesus”. Who would want to be close with or even spend time trying to be like someone that they didn’t know and like or admire? The phrase, “have a relationship with Christ” is another one of those terms that gets tossed about without a clear definition of what it means. So let us be clear: if a person turns his or her mind towards God, believes that God exists and is open to the idea that prayer is heard by God, that person has a relationship with God. It is a very weak relationship, but it is still there. Embrace exists to help each person in the parish develop that relationship so that each person is confident and secure in their relationship with Jesus and therefore is excited enough to want to tell others about it, so that others may have an enlivened relationship themselves.

Second, becoming a disciple does not mean that the person won’t have to struggle with sin. Everyone struggles with sin, whether they have a relationship with Him or not. The night He was betrayed, ALL ELEVEN of the apostles ran when Jesus was arrested. St. Peter, in the presence of Jesus, denied three times that he even knew Him! After the Ascension, they all hid. After Pentecost, when they became bold in preaching, Peter later wouldn’t eat in the house of Gentiles because of fear of what others would say about him. St. Paul had trouble with some other disciples and wouldn’t even take Mark with him on a missionary journey because of a personality conflict. Plainly, if they had trouble, we can expect difficulty also.

Embrace is the ministry that will be offering opportunities to grow as a disciple. Alpha, Connect groups, Prayer Line, Gifts and Talents already are functioning for you. In the future there will be other opportunities. We will be offering a parish-based retreat weekend, training in evangelizing other, teaching you how to develop and tell your story about what God has done for you, even a blog!

But we also want to hear from you as to what you think would help you to grow as a disciple of Jesus Christ in His Church, here at St Jerome. Now its time for you to communicate with us! What do you need in terms of opportunities in each of the six areas of discipleship behaviors in order to come into closer relationship with Jesus?

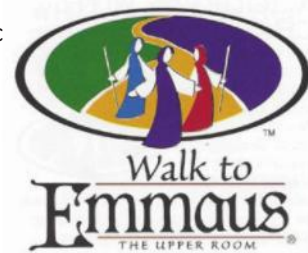

ANNOUNCING: The St. Jerome Legacy Society!



Question: What is the St. Jerome Legacy Society?

Answer: The St. Jerome Legacy Society is a way for devoted parishioners to bless future generations through a legacy gift. Everyone who indicates that they have made a legacy gift commitment to benefit St. Jerome's parish will become a member of the St. Jerome Legacy Society.

Question: What will membership in the Legacy Society entail?

Answer: St. Jerome Legacy Society Members will be honored for naming St. Jerome in their will or making another type of legacy gift. They will be special guests at the annual St. Jerome Legacy Week dinner. They will be recognized at the dinner and receive a beautiful membership pin. The Legacy Society will sponsor several other events throughout the year as well. Joining the Legacy Society is an act of gratitude to God for life's many blessings and an act of faithful generosity that will serve as a legacy of love to future generations. We honor deceased benefactors through the Sunday Mass Prayers of the Faithful. In addition, one Sunday Mass is designated in remembrance of St. Jerome deceased benefactors.

Question: What is a legacy gift?

Answer: A legacy gift is most often a bequest - a simple naming of St. Jerome's in a parishioner's will of any amount. Often bequests represent a share or all of the residual of an estate after family members benefit but it can also include an outright naming of a specific amount or a percentage of estate funds. Other popular estate gifts are charitable gift annuities, naming St. Jerome as primary or contingent beneficiary of an insurance policy, 401K plan and individual retirement account.

Question: What is a Charitable Gift Annuity and how does it benefit me?

Answer: A Charitable Gift Annuity is a contract in which a parishioner receives a guaranteed income for life in exchange for a permanent gift of \$5,000 or greater. At the end of their life, any remaining funds that have not been paid out are given to the parish.

Question: How will legacy gifts be used?

Answer: How legacy gifts are used is determined by the parishioner making the gift. Some legacy gifts are unrestricted which enable parish leaders to direct the gifts to wherever it is most needed. Because most legacy gifts are received far in the future, this flexibility can be very valuable. Or parishioners can also choose to designate their legacy gift to be used in a specific way to fund facilities or programs or to build permanent endowment funds. Some options are; Raise the Roof, Youth Shack, Fr. Sean Prayer Garden, the Music Ministry or new Parish Hall.
