

Frequently Asked Questions About the *Raise the Roof* Campaign

Q: Why do we need to fix the roof?

A: The roof on our church is failing. If you look at the roof, the black spaces showing the loss of shingles are easy to spot. That leaves just a thin layer of tarpaper protecting our church. The entire church is at risk of extensive damage from wind and rain.

Q: What are we going to do?

A: After considerable research and with assistance of the diocesan Construction Office, outside consultants and parishioners with construction and roofing experience, a decision was made that the only viable solution was to replace our failing church roof with a metal roof which will exceed all state and federal wind requirements.

Q: What will it cost?

A: The first firm bids came in at \$1.2 million, which was more than we initially thought it would cost. We are in process of putting out bids again with more contractors to try to obtain a lower bid.

Q: Why not shingle?

A: The latest estimate for a shingle roof is \$804,000, but the roof will only last about 15 years. A metal roof will cost about \$1.2 million, but it will last between 40-50 years. We will more than triple the life of our roof and save a considerable amount over time.

Q: Why run this campaign?

A: The parish doesn't have enough in savings to cover this project. Therefore, we are kicking off the Raise the Roof Campaign with a goal of

\$600,000. We are asking parishioners to make a pledge they can pay over a period of 3-years. By running this campaign now, we can raise about half of the money and take out a loan for the other half.

Q. Why is our campaign goal \$600,000 when it will cost 1.2 million to replace the roof?

A. After considerable deliberation your Finance Council choose the campaign goal of \$600,000 as we thought the \$375 per family goal would be less daunting and when we reached this is would reduce the amount and cost of the loan needed.

Q: Does this mean we won't start the project now?

A: For now, we are going to repair the immediate leaks to give us time to raise our campaign goal because we cannot afford to take on a loan of \$1.2 million now.

Q: Why pledges over 3 years?

A: Making a one-time gift of \$2,000 is difficult for anyone. But if it is spread out over 36 months, it would be about \$55 per month. A pledge over time allows our parishioners to make a larger commitment that is less of a strain on their finances.

Q: Should I give to the campaign instead of the offertory?

A: No. Our parish still needs to keep everyday operations running with offertory collections, and so this commitment must be above and beyond what you give to offertory.

This represents the financial information for the Parish for the first two quarters of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020. Operating revenues are down \$17,840 or 2% from the prior year, while total operating expenses are down \$55,468. This is due to cash flow timing where the parish has not made additional APA payments to the Diocese. We have collected \$128,491 towards our APA Assessment of \$267,573 and have a balance due to the Diocese at December 31, 2019 of \$141,512. This will need to be paid with current offertory collections and parish savings by June 30, 2020.




