Dear Friends:

I want to encourage you to continue to be faithful to Jesus' invitation to make our annual retreat with Him in the desert of Lent. The Catechism #2752 reminds us that *"The battle of prayer is inseparable from the necessary "spiritual battle" to act habitually according to the Spirit of Christ: we pray as we live, because we live as we pray."* A fruit for me so far during Lent has been to recognize Jesus' invitation to join Him in prayer. I find this at times to be a challenge but I remember Jesus praying to the Heavenly Father in John 17:21, *"...that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us..."* We will continue to have opportunities during the season of Lent to respond to Jesus' words in Matthew 6:6, to *"...go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret."* In addition, to our opportunity to join the Heavenly Father in prayer at our home, "the Domestic Church," I invite you to take advantage of the following:

- Participate in "Operation Rice Bowl"
- Attend "Stations of the Cross" at our parish on Fridays at 9:30am in the church or at 7pm in the chapel or pray the "Stations" at home
- Participate in our "Solemn Exposition of the Holy Eucharist" Thursday, March 26th – Saturday, March 28th.



Pope Benedict XVI in an address on May 26, 2009, stated that *"...the laity, must no longer be viewed as "collaborators" of the clergy but truly recognized as "co-responsible", for the Church's being and action..."* I believe in what Pope Benedict has said. I have often expressed at Mass my desire for our parish to "be more." I have had the opportunity to listen to our parishioners who have expressed their desires for their families, their children and our parish. The sharing has included listening to wonderful experiences that our parishioners have had at other parishes that they have belonged to during their life. I believe we have a wonderful parish. How did it get that way? I can assure you that it was because of people like yourself who decided to respond to what they heard Jesus saying in their hearts and they stepped up to make great things happen. I will continue to give thanks for the great things that are going on in our parish. If Jesus has placed a "longing for our parish" in your heart, respond to the call of Jesus as the people of the Scriptures have before us by saying to Jesus, *"Here I am, send me."* (Isaiah 6:8)

LENT

What does this season mean for our children and families? The effort we put into these 40 days will make the celebration of Easter a richer and fuller encounter with the Lord. Why purple? In both the Old and New Testaments, purple is found to be a rare and valuable color symbolizing royalty, wealth and status. In ancient times, the dye used to create purple was not only very expensive to produce, but it was also labor intensive. It was considered a great luxury.

In the gospels, the Roman soldiers dress Jesus in a purple robe before he begins his walk to Calvary. Each Lent, we are called as His disciples, to walk with Him on this journey. How do we speak of this to the children? We know young children are very sensitive to colors and have a great interest in them. The youngest children enjoy identifying their favorite color and take great delight in finding their favorite color in the clothes they wear, food they eat and items in their environment. In the atrium, we speak about purple as the color of waiting and preparing. Through the presentation of the Liturgical Colors, and The Liturgical Calendar (later presentation), the child discovers that the season of Lent is a time of preparation for the great feast of Easter.

Prepare as a Family

The prayer chain is always a crowd favorite. Count out how many days left in Lent and cut that many strips of paper. As a family, start a list of prayer intentions. Write one intention per strip of paper, turn the strips into a chain, and hang it up. Once per day, tear off a link in the chain, pray as a family for the intention written on it, and watch Easter come ever closer.

Find some jumbo-sized plastic Easter eggs, and write each person in the family's name on them, one name per egg. Encourage the family to do small acts of kindness for one another- secretly do a chore for them, pray a Rosary for them, leave them a small, unexpected gift. Each time they do, have them write it down on a small slip of paper - "I prayed a Rosary for you", or "I made your bed for you", "I went a day without TV for your prayer intentions" etc. - and put the paper in the person's egg. On Easter, the family opens their eggs and sees all the prayers, fasting, and acts of kindness that were done for them.

We recently learned that our Brother Fr. Lopez's Knights of Columbus Council 5737 in Pinellas Park has taken up the challenge of raising \$15,000 to help buy an ultrasound machine for the **Bay Area Pregnancy Center**. The total cost of this device is \$30,000. This needed ultrasound will show pregnant women their fetus alive and well in the womb, hoping this knowledge and some prayers might change their mind about having an abortion. In our district we have neighboring KoC Councils: Fr. Lopez, Holy Cross, and Blessed Sacrament, all of whom have agreed to raise half of the \$15,000 goal.

At this time our only source of generating profit is from the proceeds from our once-a-month breakfasts after the first three Masses. All donations collected will be applied to this goal. We are very proud of how our community fellowship breakfasts have grown and are thankful for your attendance and support.



Your KoC Council 17249 has scheduled three more breakfasts, including **March 1, 2020**. Our last breakfast, until we return in the fall, will be **May 3, 2020**, in honor of Mother's Day. You can see from the thermometer, \$5,000 has been raised.

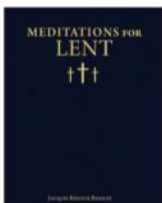

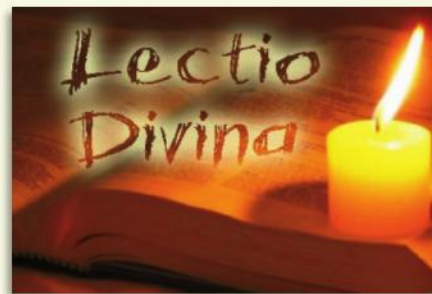
