

#### **Annual Report 2020**

**Mission:** St. Jerome Catholic Church volunteers gather to support Pinellas Hope, Clearwater, as they assist homeless adults. Operated by Catholic Charities, Pinellas Hope provides temporary shelter and unites with other necessary services. St. Jerome Homeless Ministry is committed to provide food and serve with respect, compassion and cooperation in the spirit of a unifying God. By working together each Monday, 40 volunteers develop a stronger parish community through our strong social connections as we become missionary disciples of Jesus Christ

**Donations:** There were 88 pickups of unsold bread and pastries from Oakhurst Publix and Belleair Panera. Parishioners donated items including comforters, socks, sneakers, sweatshirts, fruit, toiletries and peanut butter and jelly.

**Sandwiches:** 8,000 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches were made for future lunches.

**Dinner Meals:** 44 dinner meals were made and served. The main course consisted of chicken or beef. 420 lbs. of chicken was cooked for 14 meals (cacciatore, a la king, stew). 600 lbs. of ground beef was cooked for 30 meals (shepherd's pie, stroganoff, stew, chili mac, baked ziti, Italian beef). Stuffing was also made which included 352 gallon bags of cubed bread, 440 diced onions, 142 stalks of diced celery, 44 lbs. butter, combined with oil, poultry seasoning and chicken bouillon. Deviled eggs were a popular item. 4,800 deviled eggs were made.


Dessert was the finishing touch. 352 trays of assorted donuts, cookies, cakes, cupcakes and pastries donated by Publix and Pinera were offered.

**Serving at Pinellas Hope:** Food and donated items were loaded onto the church van as volunteers followed to serve the 7:00pm dinner each Monday. Approximately 6,600 residents were served. Most were given 2nd and 3rd helpings. They also appreciated the PB&J sandwiches and on most days the donated bananas or ice cream.

**Recognition:** Catholic Charities presented our Homeless Ministry with a "Hunger Heroes" award during an appreciation luncheon.

### Blessing Bags for the Homeless \*\*\* DONATED ITEMS NEEDED \*\*\*

Beginning the weekend of November 1st, we will be collecting items for the homeless at a table in the Gathering Space. The items will be part of "Blessing Bags," gallon- size bags that will contain about 20 items.

Please donate unused hotel toiletries and soaps, new socks, rain ponchos, toothpaste & brushes, razors, combs, crackers & beef sticks.

A group of our parishioner volunteers keep Blessing Bags in their car, and as they see someone needy on the street, they hand out the bags. Bags are also supplemented with information about shelter and food pantry options, a McDonalds meal card and other items. Since 2018, our Parish has distributed over 500 Blessing Bags to homeless.

With the assistance of the youth group, we will assemble 100 bags and make them available to parishioner volunteers beginning in November to have available in their car. A prayer circle is notified when a bag is given, and the community prays together for that homeless person. Stories combined from these volunteers are compiled into a booklet called "The Blessing Bag Chronicles."



The Solemnity of Christ the King will be celebrated next weekend, the close of the 2020 Liturgical Year. Learn more about this Solemnity from the Committee for Religious Liberty of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops.

### SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

The Solemnity of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI with the encyclical *Quas primas*. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of what he referred to as "anti-clericalism," by which he meant the attitude of those who were seeking to extirpate Christian influence from political life. We see a version of anti-clericalism today, for example, when it is suggested that belief in Catholic teachings renders a person unfit for a judicial appointment.

When our nation is beset by civic unrest, racial tension, and a pandemic, we do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over every people and nation.

#### Jesus is the Word of God made flesh, the Incarnate Lord.


"His kingship is founded upon the ineffable hypostatic union. From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures." –Quas primas, 13

Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. In him, one person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God.

### Jesus shares a law of charity to show the way to communion with God.

"Not only do the gospels tell us that he made laws, but they present him to us in the act of making them. Those who keep them show their love for their Divine Master, and he promises that they shall remain in his love." –Quas primas, 14

By being close to sisters and brothers who are suffering, we draw close to Jesus. We Catholics, as individuals and as parishes, can look for



opportunities to minister to the needs of people who are hurting and, by doing so, we will be acknowledging the kingship of Christ.

### The Church acknowledges the reign of Christ, not only privately, but publicly.

"Thus by sermons preached at meetings and in churches, by public adoration of the Blessed Sacrament exposed and by solemn processions, men unite in paying homage to Christ, whom God has given them for their King." –Quas primas, 26

Today, religious freedom for many people means that we can believe whatever we want, but when we enter the public square or the marketplace, we must conform to secularist orthodoxy. For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord, not only of the Church, but of the universe.






