We celebrate "The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe," the end of our liturgical year. "...Christ, King and Lord of the universe, made himself the servant of all, for he came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." For the Christian, "to reign is to serve him," particularly when serving "the poor and the suffering, in whom the Church recognizes the image of her poor and suffering founder." #786 Catechism of the Catholic Church.

We will begin next weekend the new Church year with our celebration of the First Sunday of Advent, which will lead us to witness God being born as a child at Bethlehem. We end and begin the Church year being pointed solidly in the direction of God's example which includes humility, service, and becoming "like a little child." Matthew 18:3.

We would like to wish everyone a "Happy Thanksgiving." If you are traveling, please know that we will be praying for a safe trip for you all. If you are in town, we invite you to join us for one of our Thanksgiving Day Masses in person or on livestream. The Mass schedule is: Wednesday, November 25th at 7:30 pm and Thursday, November 26th at 7:00 am and 9:00 am. The special chair ceremony and reading of the Thanksgiving proclamation will take place at all Masses.

We are sorry to have to announce that due to our inability to find a sponsor for our parish calendar and the necessity to be cautious about expenses, we will not be producing a parish calendar for this upcoming 2021 year. We will work diligently to find a sponsor for 2022.

The First Sunday of Advent will put us in touch with our annual traditions of the blessing of Advent Wreaths for our devotion in our homes. We will place tables in front of our church sanctuary next weekend to place your wreaths, if possible with your name on them, before Mass. The wreaths can be picked up after the end of Mass. In addition, we will begin a new tradition next weekend. Since our precautions began at church regarding the coronavirus, we have not been allowed to have Holy Water in the fonts. Since we are beginning a new liturgical year, we would like to invite everyone to bring containers of water with you to Mass next weekend for home use. We request that you put a pinch of salt in the water. The priests will bless the water as well during Mass. In addition, as has been our custom, we will once again have parishioners involved in giving a brief Advent Tree of Hope witness before our Sunday Advent Masses as well as parishioners lighting our Advent Wreath.
