

From the Pastor



Dear Friends:

The Church teaches that "....(in) the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming." #524 Catechism of the Catholic Church

We are assisted both in our church and our homes to be mindful of our awaiting the arrival of the Messiah through our use of the "Advent Wreath." The Advent wreath has German origins, and is probably the most recognized Advent custom. It is a wreath made of evergreens that is bound to a circle of wire. It symbolizes the many years from Adam to Christ in which the world awaited its Redeemer. It also represents the years that we have and will await His second and final coming. The wreath holds four equally-spaced candles, the three purple ones lit on the penitential Sundays and a pink one for Gaudete, the joyful third Sunday in Advent.

In addition to blessing Advent wreaths this weekend, we will also be blessing Holy Water for home use. "Holy water has a double meaning of reminding us of our baptism as well as a symbol of spiritual cleansing. Holy water is said to have great power over the devil, as the devil cannot stand this 'clean' water, since he is entirely unclean for all eternity. It is a reminder of the water that flowed out of Christ's side on the cross, which is a symbol of Baptism, and brings to mind the day of the devil's defeat (that is, Christ's crucifixion). It is an ancient custom to have 'holy water fonts' on the walls of a home. They are elaborate or simple cups that hold holy water, which can then be used to bless oneself throughout the day. It is especially helpful to have them at the doors that lead outside the house as well as in the bedrooms of family members. That way we keep ourselves always fixed on Christ and remind ourselves to remain pure. It also keeps the holy water handy when needed to ward off any influence of the Evil One." If by chance you did not bring a container with water to be blessed for home use, please feel free to do so anytime you come to Mass and the priests or deacon will be happy to bless the water.


In Gratitude to God For His Gifts to Us


