

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

What's going on in the Atrium? The Liturgical Calendar

The Liturgical Calendar vs. A Civil Calendar

The Church has its own calendar, which we call the "liturgical calendar." The Liturgical Calendar is different from the civil or secular calendar, which is divided into 12 months over four seasons. While the civil calendar orients us to secular life, the liturgical calendar orients us to religious life and, more importantly, helps us to re-live various aspects of the life of Jesus. When we refer to the seasons and feasts on the liturgical calendar, we are not only remembering the historical events that happened in the past, but we are celebrating what continues to happen today. We can do so because the person who is the center of our seasons and feasts is the person of the Risen Christ, who is alive and continues to be revealed to us.

Level I

The Liturgical Calendar is composed of 52 prisms, inner arcs and arrows, and two outer arcs. Each prism indicates one Sunday or week of the year, a year which is guided by three principal feasts (Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost) as well as corresponding seasons of preparation, celebration, and ordinary/growing time. The two cycles which make up the year (The Cycle of Christmas and The Cycle of Easter) have at their center the life of Jesus, the Son. As the earth travels once around the sun each year, so we "travel" around Jesus, preparing for, celebrating, and growing after the most significant events of His life. Level I children return repeatedly to this material which concretizes time and allows them to see visually and sensorially where they are in the year, a year centered around our greatest gift, the Eucharist, which is often drawn on the centerpiece of the calendar. In the words of a five-year-old who returned to building the Liturgical Calendar several weeks in a row, "Do you know why I like this work? It's so peaceful!"

RAISE THE ROOF A solid, lasting future

RAISE THE ROOF: CURRENT STATUS

The proposed roof for the church building will be a standing seam metal roof that will provide a useful life in excess of forty years. One of the biggest benefits of standing seam roofing is the hidden fastener system it uses. The hidden (or concealed fasteners), refers to the clips, screws or nails being hidden from view on the installed standing seam roof. A key benefit of hidden fasteners is that they don't puncture the standing seam metal panel itself and are not exposed to weather which could cause them to fail over time. This usually means the standing seam metal roof has a higher level 2022: **\$618,546.38** of protection from the elements, will require less maintenance, and will provide a more attractive and appealing look for the roof.

We are working hard towards the goal of **\$1.4 million**. Thank you for making a pledge today so we can expeditiously complete this needed project!
