

FROM THE PASTOR FR. TOM MORGAN

Dear Friends,

On New Year's Eve or New Year's Day, there is a lovely tradition of prayer. I invite you to consider gathering to dedicate your new year to the Lord with this prayer service.

A New Year's Blessing

The household gathers at the table or at the Christmas tree or manger scene. Many people make New Year's Day a day of prayer for peace.

All make the sign of the cross. The leader begins: Let us praise the Lord of days and seasons and years, saying: Glory to God in the highest! R/. And peace to his people on earth!

The leader may use these or similar words to introduce the blessing:

Our lives are made of days and nights, of seasons and years, for we are part of a universe of suns and moons and planets. We mark ends and we make beginnings and, in all, we praise God for the grace and mercy that fill our days.

Then the Scripture is read: Book of Genesis 1:14-19:

Listen to the words of the Book of Genesis:

God said: "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky, to separate day from night. Let them mark the fixed times, the days and the years, and serve as luminaries in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth." And so it happened: God made the two great lights, the greater one to govern the day, and the lesser one to govern the night; and he made the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth, to govern the day and the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. God saw how good it was. Evening came, and morning followed—the fourth day.

(The family's Bible may be used for an alternate reading such as Psalm 90:1-4.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, members of the household offer prayers of thanksgiving for the past year, and of intercession for the year to come. On January 1, it may be appropriate to conclude these prayers with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary (in Part VII: Litanies) since this is the solemn feast of Mary, Mother of God.

In conclusion, all join hands for the Lord's Prayer. Then the leader continues:

Let us now pray for God's blessing in the new year.

After a short silence, parents may place their hands on their children in blessing as the leader says: Remember us, O God; from age to age be our comforter. You have given us the wonder of time, blessings in days and nights, seasons and years. Bless your children at the turning of the year and fill the months ahead with the bright hope that is ours in the coming of Christ. You are our God, living and reigning, forever and ever. R/. Amen.

Another prayer for peace may be said: Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: to be consoled as to console, where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith;

where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light;

where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek

to be understood as to understand,

to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive,

it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. R/. Amen.

—Attributed to St. Francis of Assisi The leader says: Let us bless the Lord.

All respond, making the sign of the cross: **Thanks be to God.** The prayer may conclude with the singing of a Christmas carol.



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd What's going on in the Atrium? The Liturgical Calendar

Level III

In Level III, the work with the Liturgical Calendar continues. The typology study on Exodus provides an opportunity to discuss how the date of Passover is calculated and, alongside it, how the date of Easter is determined each year. The children are then able to discover when Easter will fall for the upcoming year, the year of their birth, or any other year in which they have an interest. In addition to all of the extended work with the Liturgical Calendar, there is a final expansion to this material which they were first introduced to so many years ago. The vertical Liturgical Calendar provides each child with an opportunity to create a personal calendar for the upcoming year with the weeks and seasons labeled, solemnities and days of obligation recorded, as well as one's favorite saints' days and feasts added in. The process of making a vertical Liturgical Calendar requires the use of a calendar for the current year and includes labeling the months and seasons of the calendar year and then filling in the yellow Sundays (note how the light permeates the calendar because of the five-day format)



and additional solemnities, labeling them and then adding feasts and celebrations as desired before the seasons of the liturgical year are shaded in purple, yellow, and green. Finally, the child creates the title for their vertical calendar, revealing a bit of their pondering of the liturgical year.



RAISE THE ROOF: CURRENT STATUS

The proposed roof for the church building will be a standing seam metal roof that will provide a useful life in excess of forty years. One of the biggest benefits of standing seam roofing is the hidden fastener system it uses. The hidden (or concealed fasteners), refers to the clips, screws or nails being hidden from view on the installed standing seam roof. A key benefit of hidden fasteners is that they don't puncture the standing seam metal panel itself and are not exposed to weather which could cause them to fail over time. This usually means the standing seam metal roof has a higher level of protection from the elements, will require less maintenance, and will provide a more attractive and appealing look for the roof.




