

National Safety Month - June

National Safety Month is celebrated sharing ways to reduce preventable injuries and fatalities. Parents play a crucial role in making this a reality. Knowing the common dangers and how to address them can help put you at ease.

- The leading cause of death for children under 1 is suffocation, often taking place during the sleeping hours.
- Car crashes are the second leading cause of death for children under 1 and a leading cause of death from ages 1-24, according to Injury Facts.
- Riding in a car is one of the most dangerous activities we do on a day-to-day basis it's the leading cause of preventable death for people age 5-24 and driver distraction is making this problem even worse, according to Injury Facts. Teach the dangers of distracted driving long before teens get behind the wheel.
- According to Nationwide Children's Hospital, a baby can drown in just inches of water. In fact, drowning is the leading cause of death for children ages 1 and 2, according to Injury Facts. Protecting your little ones around water is important especially in the summer.
- We practice fire emergency drills at work and school, but don't forget to create and practice a home escape plan and keep it visible, like on the refrigerator, to help family and visitors remember what to do.
- Choking is a leading cause of preventable death for children age 4 and under, according to Injury Facts, and our homes are filled with potential choking hazards. To keep your child safe, be sure you know the dangers to avoid and what to do if you witness him or her choking.


