### Dear Friends:

I want to encourage you to continue to be faithful to Jesus' invitation to make our annual retreat with Him in the desert of Lent. The Catechism #2752 reminds us that "*The battle of prayer is inseparable from the necessary "spiritual battle" to act habitually according to the Spirit of Christ: we pray as we live, because we live as we pray.*" A fruit for me so far during Lent has been to recognize Jesus' invitation to join Him in prayer. I find this at times to be a challenge but I remember Jesus praying to the Heavenly Father in John 17:21, "...that they may

at times to be a challenge but I remember Jesus praying to the Heavenly Father in John 17:21, "...that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us..." We will continue to have opportunities during the season of Lent to respond to Jesus' words in Matthew 6:6, to "...go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret." In addition, to our opportunity to join the Heavenly Father in prayer at our home, "the Domestic Church," I invite you to take advantage of the following:

- Participate in our "Lenten Penance Service with Individual Confessions" on Monday April 1, 2019 at 4pm or 7pm
- Attend the "Talents and Gifts" workshop on Saturday April 6, 2019, 9am to 12noon, at our parish center
- We are happy to announce that for the month of April 2019 we will have "additional confessions" scheduled on Wednesday (April 3, 10, 17, 24) from 9:30am to 10am and 6:30pm to 7pm in the chapel.
- We will also have for the month of April 2019 additional times for "Eucharistic Exposition" on Thursday from 5pm to 7pm, with Benediction at 6:50pm, on (April 4, 11, 25). Also, during the month of April we will have our normal Holy Hour on Friday, April 5, 2019 from 9:30am to 10:30am. We will have our "time of Adoration" on Holy Thursday, April 18, 2019 in the tent following the "Mass of the Lord's Supper." There will be no "Eucharistic Exposition" on Good Friday, April 19, 2019.
- Pray for Terrise Colaprete and Jean Wong who will receive the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil, April 20, 2019 at 8pm

Pope Benedict XVI in an address on May 26, 2009, stated that "...the laity, must no longer be viewed as "collaborators" of the clergy but truly recognized as "co-responsible", for the Church's being and action..." I believe in what Pope Benedict has said. I have often expressed at Mass my desire for our parish to "be more." I have had the opportunity to listen to our parishioners who have expressed their desires for their families, their children and our parish. The sharing has included listening to wonderful experiences that our parishioners have had at other parishes that they have belonged to during their life. I believe we have a wonderful parish. How did it get that way? I can assure you that it was because of people like yourself who decided to respond to what they heard Jesus saying in their hearts and they stepped up to make great things happen. I will continue to give thanks for the great things that are going on in our parish. If Jesus has placed a "longing for our parish" in your heart, respond to the call of Jesus as the people of the Scriptures have before us by saying to Jesus, "Here I am, send me." Updates:

- We have submitted our parish goals to Bishop Gregory Parkes in reference to three major areas of our parish life for "Courageously Living the Gospel," they include having our parish: establish and/or enhance youth ministry opportunities by July 1, 2020, enhance or establish family ministries to respond to the diverse needs of families by Pentecost 2020, and equipping our parishioners as Missionary Disciples who are inspired to invite and accompany others by Pentecost 2020. (Specific goals will soon be shared in this bulletin).
- Plans are advancing to replace the roof on our "Parish Center." We will proceed shortly to replace the roof due to the urgency and need for repair of this roof.
- We had hope to conduct "Question and Answer" sessions regarding the need to replace the roof on our church after all of our Sunday Masses this weekend and to publish a "Question and Answer" fact sheet in our parish bulletin. We are still in the process of planning these two events and will soon reschedule.
- Beginning, in April we will replace the "Debt Reduction" envelope and the "Building and Maintenance" envelope with a "Roof Fund Campaign" envelope. All funds collected from this will go toward the replacement of the church roof.
- Our loan from SunTrust, for our church renovation, which took place in 2012/2013, balloons in September 2019. Since we will need to take an additional loan to cover the expense of replacing the church roof we are in the process of consultation with our Diocese and SunTrust. The rescheduling of the "Question and Answer" sessions and "fact sheet," are meant to provide our parishioners with the opportunity to inquire into the process of our church roof replacement.
- It is our hope to replace the "Youth Shack," our portable building used in the past for our youth. I believe we need to have a space dedicated specifically for our youth. The current building is no longer usable and will be removed in the future. We are continuing our planning process to replace this building.
- St. Jerome Altar Servers of the Year for 2019 are Alex Pollard and Cassidy Shroyer. We congratulate both of these servers for their dedication. They will be honored at the Altar Server Appreciation Mass today, Sunday, March 24th at 3pm at the Cathedral of St. Jude.
