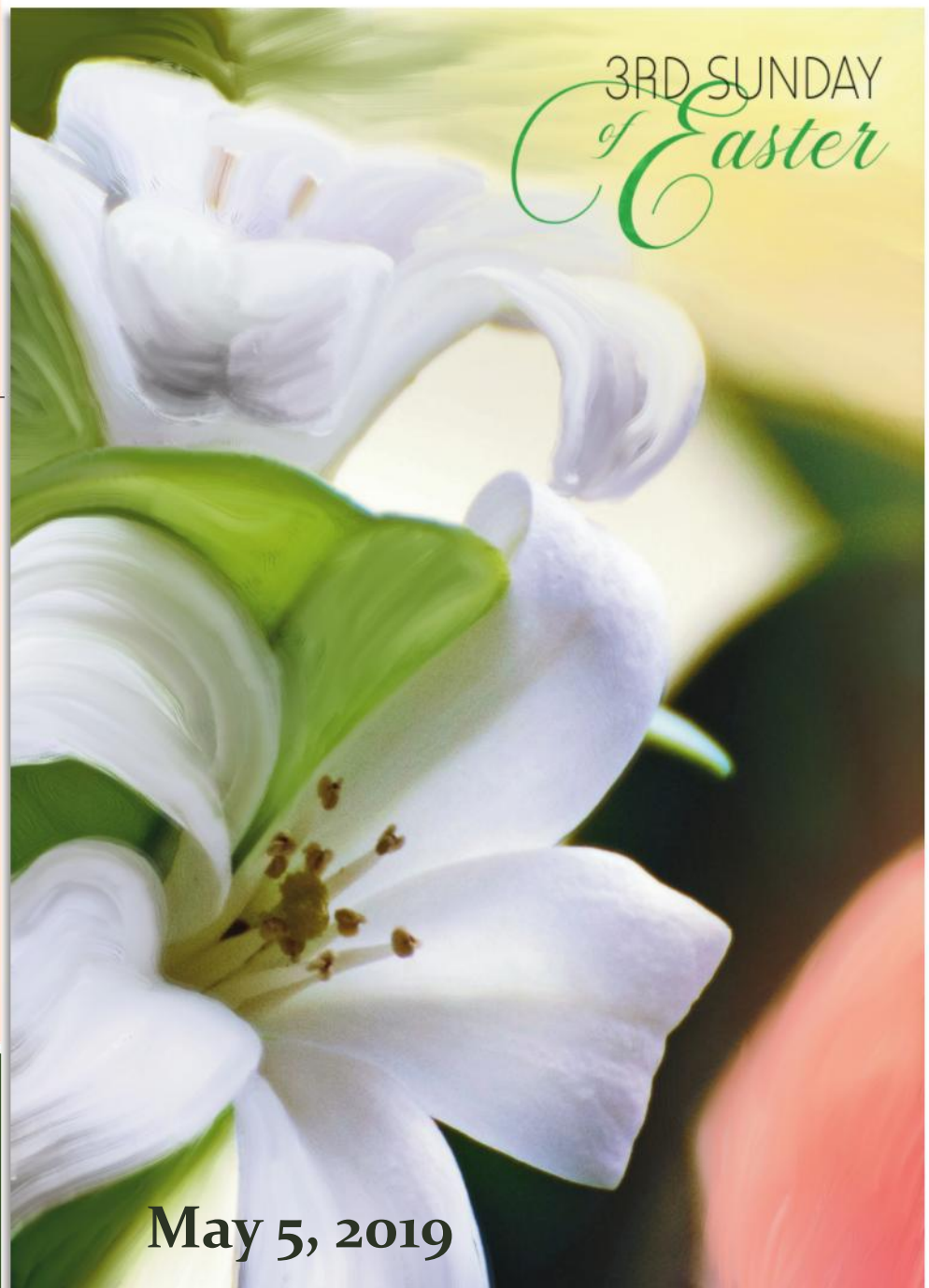

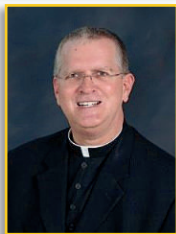

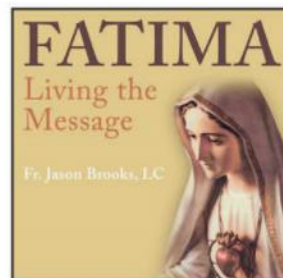

May Health Tidbits

Stroke Awareness Month

Stroke is the 5th leading cause of death in the United States. There are 2 types of strokes- one where there is a blockage in the blood supply to the brain and the other when a blood vessel in the brain ruptures. Both types of stroke prevent blood and oxygen from reaching the brain tissues. Without oxygen, brain cells and tissue become damaged and begin to die within minutes. Symptoms of a stroke show up in the body parts controlled by the damaged areas of the brain. Stroke symptoms can include:

- paralysis
- numbness or weakness in the arm, face, and leg, especially on one side of the body
- trouble speaking or understanding speech or slurring speech
- confusion
- vision problems, such as trouble seeing in one or both eyes with vision blackened or blurred, or double vision
- trouble walking or loss of balance or coordination
- dizziness
- severe, sudden headache with an unknown cause

A stroke requires immediate medical attention. If you think you or someone else is having a stroke, have someone call 911 right away. For more information on stroke and how to prevent them see: <https://www.healthline.com/health/stroke>.

Skin Cancer Detection Month

Melanoma takes the lives of 10,000 Americans every year but when it's caught early, survival rates can be more than 90%. The Skin Cancer Foundation recommends that everyone practice monthly head-to-toe self examination of their skin, so that they can find any new or changing lesions that might be cancerous or pre-cancerous. Blood Pressure Monitoring

High blood pressure is often called the silent killer. You might not have symptoms, but it's a leading risk factor for heart disease and stroke. Regularly monitoring your blood pressure, recording the readings, and taking medicines as directed can help lower your risk for heart disease and stroke. May is Healthy Vision Month

Taking care of your eyes can be a priority just like eating healthy and physical activity. People with vision problems are more likely to have diabetes, poor hearing, heart problems, high blood pressure, lower back pain and strokes, as well as have increased risk for falls, injury and depression. To keep your eyes healthy, get a comprehensive dilated eye exam at least yearly to check for common vision problems and eye diseases.
