



Dear Friends:

We will celebrate the birth of our country this week. Currently, State legislatures are debating and enacting laws that either protect human life or assure the right to an abortion. It is doubtful that any consensus on this issue will occur in our country anytime soon. Recently, I placed a quote from Thomas Jefferson's first inaugural address on our Facebook page which stated:

"All, too, will bear in mind this sacred principle, that though the will of the majority is in all cases to prevail, that will to be rightful must be reasonable; that the minority possess their equal rights, which equal law must protect, and to violate would be oppression."


Jefferson goes to the heart of our call in this moment in that even if we are in the minority on the issue of promoting the sacredness of human life from conception to natural death, we as equal citizens in our republic have a right to fight for the things that we believe. Jefferson goes on to say, *"And let us reflect that, having banished from our land that religious intolerance under which mankind so long bled and suffered, we have yet gained little if we countenance a political intolerance as despotic, as wicked, and capable of as bitter and bloody persecutions."*

We have been shaped by not only our faith but the magnificent and hopeful words of our Declaration of Independence which stated, *"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."* Human life is the foundation stone upon which all other rights stand. Let us take courage from the words of John F. Kennedy who characterized our times as, *"...a call to bear the burden of a long twilight struggle, year in year out, rejoicing in a hope of patience in tribulation."*

How will we know if we have been successful in our efforts? We will be able to mark success when we step up to the plate to help those who are contemplating having abortion to carry their child to birth and we continue to walk with them as they face the challenge of raising their child. We will mark success when somewhere down the line an adult knowing the circumstance of what their mother faced prior to their birth, that child now an adult can say, *"I am so thankful that my mother did not choose to have an abortion."*



EMBRACE: EVANGELIZATION & DISCIPLESHIP "Go and make disciples of all nations" . . . Matthew 28:19

Introducing **Embrace**: A ministry to all the people of the parish, Part 4

What, exactly, does a person do if a person is a disciple? The answer can be found by seeing what the first disciples of Jesus did in response to what Jesus was proclaiming. Jesus is often shown to have gone off by Himself to pray, sometimes through the night. The disciples who witnessed this realized that His prayer wasn't like the type of prayers they had been taught so they asked Him to teach them to pray. He gave them the prayer we know as the Our Father. So the disciples learned from Jesus' actions and words that prayer was an important part of being a follower. It is for us also. The apostles spent three years with Jesus while He taught them and the people who came out from all over Israel and the surrounding countries. Sometimes the lessons, taught in parables to the crowds, had to be explained to the Twelve. So learning and study were a big part of being a disciple. Jesus was teaching His disciples that their lives had to be focused outwardly on the people that were in need. He Himself took on the role of servant/slave to wash the feet of the Twelve at the Last Supper. Service is required of a disciple. Forgiveness of others was so important that Jesus said that it is a prerequisite to obtain forgiveness of our own sins. And He modeled this by forgiving His own executioners. It is evident from some of the gospels that providing for the needs of the poor was something that Jesus taught His disciples by word and actions. Jesus gave freely of His healing. Judas kept a purse of donations that was used to help the poor they encountered. Giving is necessary to be a disciple. And finally, all of Jesus time and all of His encounters were about inviting people to come to Him and to embrace the Kingdom of God. Inviting others to come to know God through Jesus with the help and grace of the Holy Spirit is a definite discipline of a disciple. So, prayer, study, service, forgiveness, giving and inviting. These are the behaviors or disciplines we want to establish if we want to be true disciples of Our Lord. Next: How does Embrace plan to help us all to activate these behaviors?




