Read scripture and/or some other great Catholic spiritual reading everyday for at least 20 minutes before you go to bed, in between classes, riding a bus, or when you get a few extra minutes. Pray a rosary while walking to class. Pray for the people that walk by you on the sidewalk. Pray for your professors, your classmates, for anything you are struggling with.
16. Go to Mass every Sunday, no matter what.

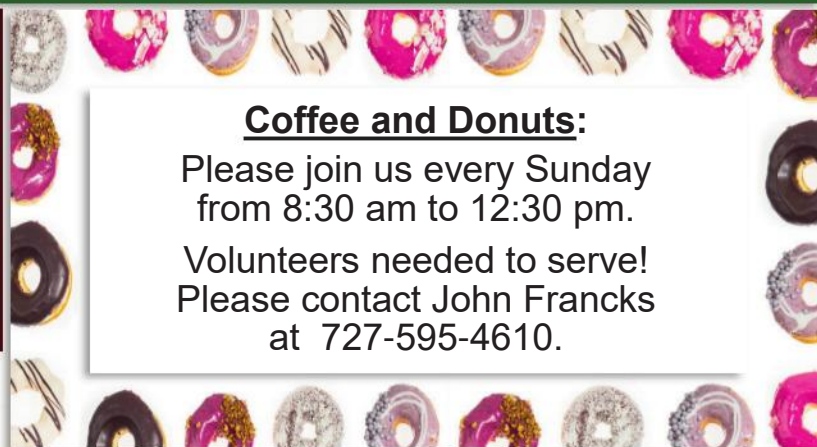

The past two years I have had the privilege and honor of serving as a FOCUS missionary at the University of Mississippi. FOCUS, which stands for the Fellowship of Catholic University Students, is a Catholic collegiate missionary organization with over 700 missionaries on over 153 college campuses. Our mission is "to know Christ Jesus and to fulfill His Great Commission."

When I started at Ole Miss two years ago, the program was only a year old. Relationships with our chaplain, campus minister, and many of the students were still in the beginning stages. Over the past two years, I have been able to witness the transforming power of Christ's love in individual hearts and in the community at large. Jesus has worked through the missionary and student-led Bible studies, through drawing students to Mass, Adoration and the Sacraments, through the many discipleship relationships, and through the joy shared within the community. He has led the hearts of the missionaries and students to a deeper relationship with Him and divine intimacy. 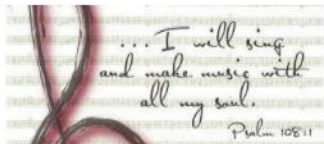
