Children of God

This week, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, which is one of the highest celebrations in the liturgical cycle of the Church. I think Thursday's second reading sums up this solemnity perfectly by stating, "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God."

We all want to be among the children of God. Because of sin and the fall, we lost our original

inheritance with God. We were created from the beginning to live with God's life in our souls, but because of selfishness we forfeited this birthright and decided we could be our own gods. This was not just an original act of disobedience, but one that we commit over and over again in our own personal lives. Every time we sin we are simply saying that our way is better. I heard a quote recently from speaker Chris Stefanick, who said, "If your god lets you do whatever you want, then your god is you."

This has been humanity's constant struggle since the fall, but the reality is that we were made from the beginning to live in the grace and light of the Lord. On this day we celebrate all those who have gone before us who wanted to reclaim their inheritance. Of course, we reclaim this inheritance through what Christ did for us on the cross. He saw his people enslaved and stepped in to bring us back into his life.

The goal of the Christian life is to live in such a way that we cooperate with the grace of the Lord and re-inherit our original birthright, to be called children of God. I am reminded of the beautiful scene from *Guardians of the Galaxy* when the ship is about to collide with earth and Groot, the half tree half human figure, knows that his friends will surely perish. Out of an act of pure love, Groot wraps his branches around his friends in order to save them from death and proclaims the famous line "We are Groot." I like to think of this scene in relation to the communion of saints. What Christ did on the cross was to save us from certain death and proclaim that we are all his family.

Pope St. John Paul II took this a step further in his reflections on Theology of the Body when he said, "The beatific vision is a union with God in his trinitarian mystery and of


intimacy with him in the perfect communion of persons (TOB 67:4)." We are all made for intimacy with God in his trinitarian love. This goal of the Christian life can be reached by reflecting on and imitating the example of all those saints who have gone before us and have fought the good fight, have run the race, and have kept the faith. Let's look to them and pray for the grace not

only to be called childrenof God here and now, but to live forever with

God perfectly united to him in heaven.



The Feast of St. Jude - A Reflection from Diocesan Publications, by Tami Urcia

The Feast of St. Jude has always been one of my favorite days. Not only did I grow up in St. Jude Parish and attend elementary school there, I also feel the need to invoke his name with certain frequency. Because life seems to throw us our fair share of seemingly impossible cases, doesn't it?

Several months back, our family went through such a time. I very unexpectedly lost my job. Being the sole breadwinner for our family of seven, it seemed that life as we knew it was coming to an end. I mean, we were just barely getting by as it was, how were we supposed to make ends meet with even less income? Where was God in all this?



Turns out, He was just about everywhere. After my tears were dried and my shock began to wear off, I immediately put the word out to family and friends. Not only did some of them send generous gifts, but others offered me side jobs or more hours at what I was already doing. Leads and suggestions began to pour in from concerned acquaintances.

But God had even more in store than simply helping me find employment. He had some work to do in my soul. By allowing me more time for prayer, I was able to dig deeply into some dusty corners of my interior and sweep out the cobwebs. I have to admit, some days it [really stung]! But I realized some mistakes I had made and some behaviors that needed changing. In the end, all I could do was thank Him for His gifts and blessings!

Just as in the Gospel for the feast of St. Jude, Jesus went up to the mountain to pray and then chose His disciples, I felt like I was being asked to come away in prayer and then being called to something greater. Not just a job to help us survive, but a mission to help us thrive.

Our first reading states "...Christ Jesus himself [i]s the capstone. Through him the whole structure is held together and grows into a temple sacred in the Lord; in him you also are being built together into a dwelling place of God in the Spirit." That's exactly what I had been missing! I was trying to build up the structure of my family's well-being based on my own strength and we were crumbling to pieces! I forgot something so central to our existence--Jesus himself is the cornerstone.

What is it you are going through today? Do you feel like you are experiencing a situation that is seemingly impossible? Do you need a gentle reminder that God is at the center and in the midst of it all? Let us invoke today's patron saint and take heart, for "God is even closer to us than we are to ourselves" (source unknown).
